

Sexual Assault Kit Tracking System (SAKTS)

Survivor Support Information

SAKTS is an online system that will be able to show you where in the process your sexual assault kit is as it moves through the criminal justice system. Agencies that handle sexual assault kits in Georgia are required by law to log the receipt and handling of all kits that come into their possession (this includes hospitals, sexual assault centers, police departments, and crime labs).

How do I access the system?

You may access the system at any time by going to the SAKTS website: <https://sakts-ga.public-safety-cloud.com>. Under “Survivor Access,” enter your Kit ID Number followed by the green “Get Status” button. Then enter the PIN you were issued at time of your forensic medical exam and click the “Get Status” button again. This will take you into the Survivor Portal.

Once inside the portal, you will be able to see a history with dates and relevant information of what entity has been and currently is in possession of your kit. There is also a survivor support section with resources.

What if I have chosen not to report my assault to law enforcement?

If you choose not to report your assault to police, your kit will be designated in the system as a “non-report.” In Georgia, law enforcement must retain all non-report kits for a minimum of one year. You will see that your kit does not move past the collection site or law enforcement agency for testing. If at any point within the first year you do decide you would like to report the assault, the kit can move forward in the testing process. Some agencies retain kits for more than one year. In those cases, kits may be able to move forward after that time frame as well.

What Information is contained in SAKTS?

There is no personal identifying information in the system (name, date of birth, address, phone number, etc.) The only information contained is the kit number and status. The system is for accountability purposes and not for the retention of personal or medical information.

What should I do if I lose my Kit Number or PIN?

Contact your advocate, your local law enforcement agency, or the agency where your forensic medical exam was conducted (this may be a hospital or sexual assault center). They should be able to locate your kit number and/or cancel your old PIN and generate a new PIN using your kit number.

Who do I contact if I have additional questions?
